Cut the following question strips apart. Give one strip to each pair of students to find the answer to and share with the group. Discuss all of the answers as a whole group to review for the weekly selection test.



Question 1:

Review page 230 to find a specific detail about Bear.
How did Bear become so wealthy?



Question 2:

The setting of a story is **where** and **when** it takes place. How would you describe the **place** where the story takes place? What **time of year** does the story take place?



Question 3:

Reread pp. 231 - 232. What was the problem that Hare and his family faced?



Question 4:

Think about Bear's character. Is he someone you would want as your business partner? If not, then why do you think Hare wanted to go into business with him?



Question 5:

Reread pp. 234 - 235 for details of the story. What did Bear do while Hare and his family grew the crops?



Question 6:

Reread pp. 236 - 237. With the first crops, Hare tricked Bear into getting the best part of the plants. However, Bear still asked Hare to plant the field a second time. What did Bear plan on happening with the second harvest?



Question 7:

This story is a fantasy. That means that it has events that could not really happen. What is an event from this story that could not really happen?



Question 8:

If you had to tell someone **in a few words** what the main idea of this story is, what would you say?

Use those words to make another title for this story.

What would your new title be?



Question 9:

What are the three reasons an author writes a story?

Why do you think the author wrote this story?



Question 10:

Skim pages 234, 237, and 241. You will find the sentence, "It's a done deal, Bear." on all three of those pages. Use context clues to figure out what Hare meant by this. What did Hare mean when he used that sentence?
